





Looking ahead, we have Interschool Sport in Volleyball, Cricket, Softball and Tennis, as well as our 7-9 Athletics Carnival on Thursday 20th March. In Week 8 we will celebrate Harmony Week and host the Book Fair, which I'm sure will bring lots of fun activities for our students.

A reminder for our secondary students... It's important to have fun, build relationships, stay organised and be dedicated to your studies throughout the duration of the year. But it's also important to be kind to yourself and reach out to your teachers if you need any support.





## 3 Year Old Kinder

(Duck, Fish & Yabby group)

As the 3 year old children begin their kindergarten journey, the children are all working towards settling into their new learning environment.

The children have been participating in orientation sessions. The shorter days provide the children time to settle into the program and to become more familiar with their teachers, peers and kinder routine.

During the session, the children have been engaging in indoor/outdoor play, music and movement and story times.

We will be working on building the children's independence, by supporting them with placing their bags into their locker, drink bottles on the trolley, opening and closing their bags/lunch boxes, personal hygiene and toileting and encouraging them to seek out help from their teachers.

We are looking forward to children in the three year olds receiving their Kinder Kits.

This year, Kinder Kits are packed into a high-quality backpack made with recycled materials. The backpacks have adjustable padded straps and an easy-to-use zip that opens to reveal a felt board on which children can create a story using the provided felt stickers.







## 4 Year Old Kinder

(Turtle, Snake & Frog Group)

We are excited about a year filled with learning, fun, and new friendships. Our orientation for four-year-olds has been a success. The children have been engaging in various indoor and outdoor activities to help them settle in and choose where they prefer to play.

It is heartening to see the connections the children are forming with their teachers and how they are communicating their interests and needs. We extend our gratitude to all the families for providing valuable information during the interview process, which enables us to build strong relationships with your children.

This term, our four-year-olds will take part in numerous play-based activities designed to enhance their language, social skills, literacy, numeracy, and self-help abilities. Teachers will initiate discussions regarding library visits scheduled for term two, leading to each child decorating their own library bag, which will be supplied by Creekside Kinder. Additionally, the children will participate in a responsible pet incursion to learn about pet care, responsibility, and safety. Additionally, we will celebrate Easter with a delightful egg hunt, promoting both fun and community engagement.







## **Prep**

Our new Creekside College Preps have made an amazing start to their first year of Primary School. They all attended an individual one hour interview with their new teacher where we were able to get to know and gather some information about their maths, phonics and oral language skills.

Our four Prep classes are now at school five days a week for the full day. The students have settled beautifully and are eagerly absorbing all the new information. The days have been filled with learning their new morning and afternoon routines and developing shared classroom expectations with their teachers.

In Literacy, classes have been focusing on shared story time and students selecting books they enjoy from the classroom library to read during independent reading time. We have had a big focus on fine motor exercises in writing to support correct pencil grip and stamina. Students have loved learning how to hold a pencil and use scissors correctly and do finger gym with their new friends Pevan and Sarah.

In Maths, we are learning to count small collections using the strategy of move and count - focusing on pace and accuracy. We are also learning about 2D shapes and identifying them in the environment around us.

Our focus in Health is creating safe, respectful classrooms. Students have loved discovering all the new places in our school including the Prep Playground, Big Hill, Canteen, Office and Sick Bay. We are also learning how to identify our emotions and develop strategies to solve problems we may encounter. Students are also learning to determine the scale of a problem and who may be able to help them solve it.



#### Welcome to Year 1!

We have had a wonderful start to the year, focussing on establishing new friendships and getting to know each other. We have shared details about ourselves to make new friends that have shared interests.

As a class, students have been organising their amazing classroom libraries into different categories, as well as brainstorming books we would like to borrow from the library that interests us. In reading, we have been exploring the difference between fiction and non-fiction texts using their features, which has also helped us categorise books.

In numeracy we have been learning about digits. We have been practicing how to read, make and order two-digit numbers using a range of materials. Students have loved exploring all the maths materials we have within our classroom and learning how to use these to help us learn.

Currently in writing, students have been participating in writing community tasks. This has looked like writing about something they love, their interests or things they enjoy. The year 1's completed a work task where they wrote from their heart and absolutely loved choosing a different piece each day to write about.

Thank you for being the wonderful Year 1 students that you are and we cannot wait to continue watching you grow.










#### Welcome to Grade 2!


We have also been having a lot of fun playing Michael Minas games to warm our brains up for all the amazing learning we are about to do each day!













Students have also explored the Zones of Regulation, each creating their own individual chart to reflect on their emotions and identify which zone they are in throughout the day.

They've practiced letter writing and used persuasive language techniques to write a letter to Duncan from *The Day the Crayons Quit*.

In Math, students have been working on reading, writing, and representing whole and decimal numbers. They've also applied written strategies to help solve addition and subtraction problems, strengthening their problem-solving

skills.



Woohoo! Year 5 is off to a *fantastic* start! We've set up our classrooms and have collaborated as a whole class to come set up our classroom expectations! and the best part? We got to CHOOSE our own rewards that we would like to see in our classroom! Talk about democracy in action!







Excitement is building as several excursions coming up, including to the Organ Pipes and Kryal Castle. The students are eagerly looking forward to it.




The Year 9 students have settled in well to their final year at Creekside. The students have started getting to know their teachers and new classmates and have made a smooth transition into being the new leaders of the school.




## **Upcoming Events**

## Establishing Reading Routines at Home

#### <u>Prep</u>

Make time for reading with your child every day

For young children, being read to or watching you read helps them:

- Understand how language works
- Build on their vocabulary
- Develop early skills toward reading

Try to choose books together with your child, building on your child's interests.

- Talk about what you are reading
- Talk about who the characters are and what happens in the books you read together
- Encourage them to express opinions about what happens in the story
- Talk about what their favourite part of the story was
- Talk about how the story made them feel

If you're reading a familiar story, your child can join in, complete rhymes, or tap along to a beat. Don't worry about reading the same story more than once. Children love to hear stories over and over again.

Things to practise when reading:

- Holding the book the right way
- Finding the front cover, back cover, spine, blurb, author and illustrator
- Reading the words from left to right
- Turning the pages carefully
- Finding a letter, a word or a sentence





Reading is a form of entertainment, and helps children to learn new ideas and skills. We want to develop curious and engaged readers - children who enjoy reading a range of texts for a variety of purposes.



- read with your child at every opportunity
  - create an inviting reading space at home
  - set up a bookcase filled with your child's favourite book genres and authors
  - visit local libraries
  - read picture story books to your child and discuss the plot / characters / morals
  - read recipes and food reviews
  - model how to research questions online
  - read online magazines and blogs
  - read pamphlets and gaming manuals

It's also important to remember that the purpose of reading is to understand what we read; therefore we must have discussions before, during and after reading.

#### Year 6-9

Find a book that is associated with something that your child enjoys:

- Many of the stories within TV shows and films that students in Year 6-9 enjoy were inspired by a novel.
   Similarly, many sports players, celebrities and influencers have written novels inspired by their lives.
- Have discussions with fam ily friends about what their children are reading. Students in grade 6-9 are often more motivated to read when recommended books by a peer or trusted friend, especially when they know they can talk about what they have read.





#### 1. Maintain a positive attitude

A lot of kids (and adults) feel anxiety when presented with a math problem. But if your child is struggling with a concept, that doesn't mean they're bad at math. You're not bad at math either! Math is a skill that takes practice, just like any other. You'll learn it, even if it's confusing right now. This just means you don't understand it yet.

Encourage this attitude with your child to help them build their math confidence. They can grow into math understanding, but it takes time. Use a growth mindset approach and you'll both be amazed at what you can learn.


